



Caring for St Veep Churchyard

1. Flowers and Plants

- If the headstone doesn't include a vase then flowers and plants must be placed in a removable container, flush with the ground.
- Objects that don't comply or are no longer needed may be removed by the PCC.

2. Vases as Memorials

- Vases should be no taller or wider than 30cm (12 inches) and no more than 25cm (10 inches) front to back.
- Vases must be securely fixed to a foundation stone, flush with the ground.

3. Wreaths and cut flowers

- Wreaths and cut flowers must be removed once they have withered.
- Poppies, Christmas wreaths, and artificial flowers, may stay for up to two months.
- Flowers or wreaths that have become unsightly may be removed

4. Disposal of waste

- There is a compost bin and a rubbish bin by the toilet block. Please take recyclable material home with you.

PLEASE DON'T DUMP RUBBISH IN THE CHURCHYARD.
